

ALABAMA STATE UNIVERSITY BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING PRESIDENT'S CONFERENCE ROOM, COUNCILL HALL ROOM 130 FEBRUARY 4, 2011 2:00 P.M.

MINUTES

I. CALL TO ORDER

The reconvened meeting of the Alabama State University Board of Trustees was called to order by Chairman Elton Dean at 2:00 p.m. in the President's Conference Room, Councill Hall Suite 130.

II. INVOCATION

The invocation was given by Mr. Keith Edwards, Director of Student Activities.

III. ESTABLISHMENT OF QUORUM

President William Harris affirmed a quorum. Those present were Trustees Dean, Crawley, Crutcher, Figures, Junkins, Sawyer, Wiggins, and Young. Trustees Green, Lemak, and Hodge were absent.

IV. ADOPTION OF AGENDA

Trustee Wiggins moved to adopt the agenda. The motion was seconded by Trustee Crawley and passed unanimously.

V. ADOPTION OF MINUTES – OCTOBER 29, 2010

Trustee Wiggins moved, seconded by Trustee Junkins, to adopt the minutes of October 20, 2010. The motion passed by unanimous vote.

VI. PRESIDENT'S REPORT

President Harris informed the Board that his report would come through the various reports of the standing committees.

VII. COMMITTEE REPORTS

A. ACADEMIC AFFAIRS COMMITTEE

In the absence of Trustee Hodge, Chairman of the Academic Affairs Committee, Interim Provost Alfred Smith presented two resolutions to the Board for approval.

1. RESOLUTION TO APPROVE NAME CHANGE FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF SOCIOLOGY AND CRIMINAL JUSTICE

Trustee Wiggins moved to adopt the Resolution to approve the name change for of the Department of Sociology and Criminal Justice to the Department of Criminal Justice and Social Sciences. Trustee Young seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

2. RESOLUTION TO APPROVE THE MASTER OF SCIENCE DEGREE PROGRAM IN PROSTHETICS AND ORTHOTICS

Trustee Wiggins moved, seconded by Trustee Crutcher, to adopt the Resolution approving the Master of Science Degree Program in Prosthetics and Orthotics. The motion passed by unanimous vote.

B. ATHLETICS COMMITTEE

There were no action items from the Athletics Committee.

Executive Vice President introduced Mr. Damon Evans who has been hired as a consultant for Athletics.

Mr. Evans made a brief report to the Board. He stated that he is working closely with Athletic Director Stacy Danley to develop an Athletics Strategic Plan. The Plan will include a comprehensive review of the organizational structure of the Athletics Department. He further informed the Board that recommendations will be made to the University administration and subsequently forwarded to the Board for approval.

C. FINANCE COMMITTEE

There were no action items from the Finance Committee.

D. PROPERTY COMMITTEE

There were no action items from the Property Committee.

E. STUDENT AFFAIRS COMMITTEE

There were no action items from the Student Affairs Committee.

VIII. EXECUTIVE SESSION

Trustee Crawley moved, seconded by Trustee Crutcher, to convene for executive session.

President Harris asked that Executive Vice President Knight, Athletic Director Stacy Danley, and Damon Evans be allowed to join the Executive Session. There were no objections.

IX. REPORT FROM EXECUTIVE SESSION

President Harris stated that there was no report from the Executive Session.

X. APPROVAL OF PERSONNEL ACTIONS REPORT (September 14, 2010 thru January 19, 2011)

Upon motion by Trustee Crutcher and seconded by Trustee Crawley, the Board approved the personnel actions from September 14, 2010 through January 19, 2011 by majority vote. Trustee Wiggins abstained.

XI. REPORT FROM FACULTY SENATE - Dr. Derryn Moten

Dr. Moten did not have a formal report. However, he distributed a document to the Board which outlined some concerns of the Faculty Senate for information only.

XII. REPORT FROM SGA PRESIDENT – Ms. Ashley Thomas

Ms. Thomas reported that the SGA Constitution has been passed by the Student Senate. She informed the Board that the Constitution has been circulated to the University Administration for comments and input. She said that students will have an opportunity to vote on the Constitution on Blackboard on Thursday and Friday, February 10-11, 2011. It is the goal of the SGA to have the Constitution approved before the April 2011 SGA elections.

XIII. REPORT FROM NON- INSTRUCTIONAL STAFF COUNCIL – Ms. Georgette Varner

Mrs. Varner stated that there was no formal report from the Non-Instructional Staff Council. She thanked the Board and the Administration for no layoffs during the current fiscal year.

XIV. OTHER BUSINESS

Trustee Sawyer inquired about the matter of the increase of on-campus parking fees. She expressed concern about whether adequate notification was given to the campus community about the increase.

President Harris responded that all faculty, staff and students were made aware of the increase in parking fees well in advance of the implementation date. He said that the University leadership examined the matter closely, and determined that there were two primary reasons for increasing the parking fees: 1) the availability of spaces; and, 2) that there had not been an increase in parking for more than ten years. After a thorough review and comparison of parking at other institutions, the administration agreed to increase general parking from \$125.00 to \$150.00, and reserved parking from \$150.00 to \$300.00. He further stated that he would have a timeline drafted for Trustee Sawyers' review that would show the sequence of the discussions and announcements that went out to the campus community about the parking increase.

Trustee Young asked if the Capital Campaign report was on target to be presented at the May Board meeting.

Vice President Kennedy-Lamar affirmed that the University would be prepared to present the Capital Campaign presentation at the May Board meeting.

Trustee Dean acknowledged Ms. Debra Scott Thomas to address the Board.

Ms. Thomas informed the Board of the upcoming National HBCU Conference that will be held on March 7-10, 2011 on the campus of ASU. She encouraged the Board, Administration, faculty, staff and students to support the conference by attending the various sessions.

XV. RECESS

Trustee Wiggins moved to recess the meeting to reconvene at the call of the Chair. Trustee Crawley seconded the motion and it passed unanimously. The meeting recessed at 3:35 p.m.

WHEREAS, prosthetics and orthotics is a dynamic and expanding health profession; and

WHEREAS, the College of Health Sciences has researched and found that there is an increased need for orthotists and prosthetists with the increasing number of service men and women returning to the states with medical problems that require services of an orthotist and/or prosthetist; and

WHEREAS, out of the ten (10) prosthetic and orthotic accredited practitioner programs in the United States, none are on the campus of a historically black university; and

WHEREAS, the Academic Affairs Committee of the Board of Trustees approved the recommendation to move forward in implementing the Master of Science in Prosthetics and Orthotics Degree Program; and

WHEREAS, a Notification of Intent to Submit a Proposal (NISP) was prepared and submitted to the Alabama Commission on Higher Education; and

WHEREAS, favorable responses were received which led to Alabama State University submitting a proposal for the implementation of the Master of Science in Prosthetics and Orthotics Degree Program to the Alabama Commission on Higher Education; and

WHEREAS, the proposal to offer the Master of Science in Prosthetics and Orthotics Degree Program is scheduled for review by the Alabama Commission on Higher Education's general executive committee at its meeting March 11, 2011.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, THAT, upon approval of the Alabama Commission on Higher Education for Alabama State University to offer the Master of Science in Prosthetics and Orthotics Degree Program, the Alabama State University Board of Trustees approve the implementation of the Master of Science in Prosthetics and Orthotics Degree Program.
