

Central Alabama Regional Education In-service Center



Alabama's 11 Regional Inservice Centers were created by the legislature to enhance the training of school personnel in critical needs areas. The concept and mandate were adopted in May 1984 (Act 84-622), establishing centers to provide "rigorous inservice training in critical needs areas for the state's public school personnel, teachers, superintendents, principals, and local board of education members."

The current ASU Regional Inservice Center Governing Board includes representatives from the following school systems: Autauga County Schools, Dallas County Schools, Lowndes County Schools, Montgomery Public Schools, Perry County Schools, Pike Road Schools, Selma City Schools, and Wilcox County Schools. In addition, the board features representatives from the Alabama State University College of Education and the Alabama State Department of Education.

Professional Career Continuum for Teaching



What is National Board Certification?

National Board Certification is an advanced teaching credential that complements but does not replace, an educator's Professional Educator Certificate. It is one of the most respected professional certifications available in the field of education and provides many professional benefits to teachers, students, and schools. It is valid for 5 years, and renewal candidates must begin the renewal process during their eighth or ninth year as a National Board Certified Teacher (NBCT) National Board Certification is achieved upon successful completion of a voluntary assessment program designed to recognize accomplished teachers who meet high standards based on what teachers should know and be able to do.

Look for professional learning sessions specifically designed to aid candidates in the National Board Certification process, as well as the opportunity to join the ASU Inservice Center's Regional NBCT Support Program to help guide you through the entire process from the beginning to the end.

The Proven Impact of Board-Certified Teachers on Student Achievement

Through National Board Certification, teachers demonstrate that their teaching meets the profession's standards for accomplished practice through a rigorous, peer-reviewed and performance-based process, similar to professional certification in fields such as medicine. In achieving Board certification, teachers prove their ability to advance student learning and achievement.

More than a decade of research from across the country confirms:

Students taught by Board-certified teachers learn more than students taught by other teachers.

Estimates of the increase in learning are on the order of an additional one to two months of instruction. The positive impact of having a Board-certified teacher (NBCT) is even greater for minority and lowincome students.¹ This improvement in student outcomes is mirrored by NBCTs achieving stronger results on leading measures of teacher effectiveness, including robust classroom observations and value-added scores. The compelling research on the effectiveness of Board-certified teachers is particularly noteworthy when compared to the lack of consistent research on the effectiveness of teachers with master's degrees.²

Students of NBCTs demonstrate evidence of deeper learning nearly three times more frequently than their peers

National Board Certification is a voluntary advanced professional certification for PreK-12 educators that identifies teaching expertise through a performance-based, peer-reviewed assessment.

81% of Americans across the political spectrum believe teachers should achieve Board certification, beyond licensure, as it is in other professions (2014 PDK/Gallup poll).³

ATLAS Impacts Teacher Candidates' Practice

ATLAS, from the National Board, is a video case library that demonstrates effective approaches to teaching and makes accomplished practice accessible for in-service and pre-service teachers. Each case features a National Board-certified teacher in the classroom. More than 1,300 cases include authentic unedited video, the teacher's commentary about the lesson, and related instructional materials. While ATLAS cases are indexed to common teacher frameworks such as eATPA and InTASC, the National Board standards and ATLAS cases provide a consistent vision of accomplished practice across a teacher's career.



Study Methodology and Findings

Funded by an Investing in Innovation Fund (i3) grant, exploratory research was conducted to gather evidence from teacher candidates who interacted with ATLAS in their course at Central Washington University.

ATLAS's influence on thinking about planning, instruction, and assessment:

- ATLAS activities had a moderate to major effect on
- planning, instruction, and assessment
- 93% of teacher candidates remarked that ATLAS was helpful in using assessment to inform instruction.

Written commentary's role in identifying important classroom events:

 The teacher's commentary created a greater shift in thinking about teaching because it helped develop a fuller understanding of what goes into accomplished teaching in today's classrooms.

Link to edTPA

As part of the edTPA process, teacher candidates submit video of their instruction along with a commentary. In completing the edTPA, teacher candidates often struggle providing in-depth analysis/reflection on their teaching.

Engaging with ATLAS cases may help address the novice-expert noticing gap by providing concrete examples of accomplished teachers' rich and thoughtful commentaries, anchored to the teacher's knowledge of the instructional context, students, and research-based practices.

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Responses From Participants

"I just think there is so much more that goes into planning a lesson than I originally thought. On the surface, it may seem very simple, but when you read the accompanying reflection, you see all the reasons the instructor made the decisions that they made and that makes it richer for us from a learning perspective."

"After watching these ATLAS cases, I have realized there are many ways to assess children that I did not even know about. After seeing how these teachers write about it has also helped me understand how to analyze the students."
