FACULTY SECURE GRANTS TO ADVANCE SOCIAL WORK LEADERSHIP AND HEALTH EQUITY


Last summer, social work faculty members were awarded two impactful grants that promise to enhance both social work education and community health outcomes.

The first grant supports the Phi Alpha Connected: A Virtual Community of Leadership, Learning, & Service initiative, co-led by Drs. Tabitha Brookins and Ashley Cochran. This innovative virtual platform aims to extend the mission of the Phi Alpha Honor Society beyond traditional induction ceremonies, offering social work students, especially those in online and distance programs, a year-round space for leadership development, academic growth, and community service. Aligned with ASU's Focus 2030 goals, Phi Alpha Connected fosters student success, civic engagement, and global connectivity, embodying the society's motto: "Through Knowledge—the Challenge to Serve."

The second grant funds the ACCESS Project: Assessing Barriers to Cancer Screening Among Underserved Women in Alabama's Black Belt, a collaborative effort by Dr. Tabitha Brookins and Dr. Riane Hinton. This project seeks to reduce breast cancer disparities by improving screening access through policy education and community outreach. By increasing awareness of insurance coverage and providing culturally relevant health education, the ACCESS Project aims to boost breast cancer screening rates among African American women in underserved regions, ultimately contributing to better health outcomes and equity.










MSW GRADUATES EARN LICENSURE CREDENTIALS






Dr. Abdirahman M. Dahie Visits to Boost Partnership with Somali National University


