Reporting requirements

Recipient shall promptly comply with Section 18004(c) of the CARES Act and (i) report to the Secretary thirty (30) from the date of this Certificate and Agreement and every forty-five (45) days thereafter in accordance with CFR 200.333 through 2 CFR 200.337, or in such other additional form as the Secretary may specify, how the grants were distributed to the students, the amount of each grant awarded to each student, how the amount of each grant was calculated, and any instructions or directions given to students about the grants; and (ii) document that Recipient has continued to pay all of its employees and contractors during the period of any disruptions or closures to the greatest extent practicable, explaining in detail all specific actions and decisions related thereto, in compliance with Section 18006 of the CARES Act.

1. Report to the Secretary thirty (30) from the date of this Certificate and Agreement.

The Recipient's Funding Certification and Agreement was executed by Christine C. Thomas on April 23, 2020. This report is submitted on May 26, 2020. May 26, 2020 is the submittal date since May 23, 2020 is on a Saturday and Monday May 25, 2020 is a National Holiday, Memorial Day.

2. How the grants were distributed to the students.

The University determined that the distribution of grants would be in compliance with guidance provided in the document provided by the United States Department of Education. According to the *Frequently Asked Questions about the Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under Section 18004 of the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act* developed by the United States Department of Education, a student who has demonstrated eligibility to participate in programs under Section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965, as amended (HEA), by filing a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) for academic year 2019-2020 is eligible to receive an emergency financial aid grant from ASU. Students who did not file

a FAFSA are also eligible to receive an emergency financial aid grant from ASU if you are U.S. citizenship or eligible noncitizen; have a valid Social Security number; registered with Selective Service (if the student is male); and have obtained a high school diploma, GED, or completed a high school in an approved homeschool setting.

The University determined student eligibility by the criteria identified above and as follows:

- Students enrolled in on-campus classes as of March 13, 2020 with a FAFSA on file.
- Students enrolled in on-campus classes as of March 13, 2020 who have not filed a FAFSA if they meet the following criteria:
 - US citizen or eligible noncitizen
 - A valid social security number
 - Registration with selective service (if male)
 - Not exclusively in an online program as of March 13, 2020
 - High School Diploma, GED, or completion of high school in an approved homeschool setting

These students were required to certify they have or met the above criteria.

The following criteria will be used to determine who is not eligible to receive funds from the emergency financial aid grant:

- Students who did not incur expenses related to the disruption of campus operations due to coronavirus.
- Students who was enrolled in ASU's fully online-only program or prior to the campus closure due to COVID-19
- Students who were incarcerated during the campus closure
- International Students

3. The amount of each grant awarded to each student.

3,410 students were deemed eligible in the initial population. \$3,142,232 divided by 3,410 students which yielded \$921.48 distributed to the eligible population. After beginning the process of processing the refunds, it was determined that adjustments had to be made to the initial population. As a result, some students became eligible who were not included in the initial population and some students became ineligible who were included in the initial population.

4. How the amount of each grant was calculated.

The total amount of the Award of \$3,142, 232 was divided by the total number of eligible students which was 3,410 in the initial population. At this time, \$2,959,793.56 has been distributed.

5. Any instructions or directions given to students about the grants.


Consistent with Section 18006 of the CARES Act, the University has continued to pay its employees as well as the contractors during this period.
